

RWE names Alstom 'Best Contractor' for EHS at Pembroke

Britain's biggest CCGP Pembroke scoops 'Health & Safety Best Contractor 2012' award from RWE for outstanding EHS commitment

Alstom Thermal Power was once again honoured for its commitment to EHS when in January 2013 RWE named it 'Health & Safety Best Contractor/Sub-contractor 2012' thanks to exemplary work at the Pembroke CCGT project in south-west Wales. The presentation was made at RWE Technology's Essen headquarters in Germany to the Pembroke Project Director Ken Larsen, who attended on behalf of his team.

"It is great to have recognition from RWE for all the hard work we put in to ensure that EHS was always at the top of the agenda at Pembroke," says Ken.

The Pembroke team received the Health & Safety Award 2012 after an extensive global audit of all projects managed over the year by RWE Technology, with Alstom's project seeing off strong competition from major competitor companies.

The strength of EHS delivery within Alstom's execution strategy was emphasised at the award ceremony by senior RWE leaders, who noted that they have now adopted Alstom's strategy and approach at Pembroke as their own company standard.

"It is a clear compliment that what we did at Pembroke in terms of EHS has now been taken onboard by RWE," says Ken.

The high site standards at Pembroke – Britain's biggest combined cycle power plant - had previously been acknowledged with a 'Sword of Honour' from the British Safety Council in 2011, and then the first Alstom Gas Project EHS Award in 2012.
